



**NEVADA RIDER
MOTORCYCLE SAFETY PROGRAM
RULES OF CONDUCT**

The Rules of Conduct help ensure that courses are conducted in a positive, efficient and professional manner.

Rules of Conduct for Instructors include the following:

1. Conduct courses that meet the standards of the Program and curricula provider and only at recognized Nevada Rider training sites.
2. Maintain a positive student environment. Facilitate all parts of the curriculum, encouraging student interaction through adult learning principles.
3. Correctly demonstrate all range exercises; correctly evaluate and coach student riding skills.
4. Maintain student safety to the highest degree possible.
5. Demonstrate safe riding habits by always wearing protective gear when riding to, from and during rider training activities or when representing the Program in any capacity.
6. Currently operate a motorcycle on a frequent basis, exclusive of operating a training motorcycle during course presentation.
7. Drive and ride free of alcohol and other drugs that cause impairment.
8. Maintain a good driving and riding record.
9. Stay current with CPR and First Aid certifications or, CPR and ASMI certifications.
10. Attend instructor Professional Development Workshops, as specified in the Program Manual. At a minimum, attend one Program sponsored workshop every two years.
11. Keep the Program informed of any personal and email address changes; return Program surveys promptly.
12. Instructors shall discontinue any use or promotion that the Program, in its sole discretion, finds to be negative or injurious to the Program and its mission*.
13. Department of Public Safety instructor licensing acknowledges that a person is only licensed to teach courses, for which they have been certified by the approved curricula provider, at recognized Nevada Rider training providers.
14. Instructors shall conduct themselves in a professional manner that includes: appropriate appearance and language; exhibiting positive verbal and written messages; and positive interaction with others that is free of intimidation or threat, consistent with the best interest of the Program and its mission.
15. Instructors are encouraged to support motorcycle safety programs and are not prohibited by the Program from speaking to the media, participating in a legislative or legal process, or expressing their opinions as private citizens and experienced training professionals. However, Instructors shall not present themselves as speaking on behalf of the Program while taking a public position on safety or legislative issues or when addressing a public-policy forum. Instructors are free to serve as an expert witness on motorcycle safety issues based solely on their knowledge of motorcycling and familiarity with the approved curriculum. Instructor licensing in and of itself does not qualify a person as an expert witness.
